

Easy Sunday Dinner

Layer in a large casserole with a cover.
Layers are the order listed in the recipe starting with hamburger followed by potatoes, etc.

1 pound hamburger (browned & drained)
3 peeled potatoes sliced thin (Horizontally)
3 peeled carrots sliced thin (Horizontally)
(optional 1/4 Green Pepper Slivered)
1 small onion peeled and sliced (Horizontally)
Season with salt and pepper
2 can vegetable beef soup

12 ounces shredded cheddar. (1/2 hour into baking time put on.)

Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. Top with cheese. Cover and Bake 30 minutes more or Until vegetables tender.

Serves 4-6.
