On July 2, 1776, the Continental Congress declared the American Colonies to be free and independent states. It took the delegates two days to agree on a formal document announcing their actions. On July 4, the Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence. Only Continental Congress President John Hancock and Secretary Charles Thompson signed the rough draft that day. The 55 other delegates had to wait almost a month for the final document to be carefully engrossed on parchment which they signed on August 2, 1776. Independence Day has been celebrated nationwide since 1777, the first anniversary of the signing.

Declaration of Independence Facts

- The Declaration of Independence was adopted on July 4, 1776, more than a year after the Revolutionary War began (April 1775).
- Thomas Jefferson of Virginia was asked to do the actual writing because of his "peculiar felicity of expression".
- The original Declaration of Independence was engrossed on one sheet of parchment measuring 24 1/2 x 29 3/4 inches. Engrossing is the process of preparing an official document in a large, clear hand. Parchment is an animal skin specially treated and stretched to create a strong, long-lasting writing support. The printed version was put on paper and was read aloud from town squares throughout the colonies.
- Thomas Jefferson said, "We must all hang together or most assuredly we will all hang separately."
