





Rick's Swedish Jam Shortbread Shortbread:

1 pkg. Pillsbury Plus Butter Cake Mix

1/2 cup finely chopped nuts

1/4 cup margarine or butter, softened

1 Egg

10-oz. jar raspberry preserves or jam

Glaze:

1/2 cup powdered sugar

2 1/2 teaspoons water

1/2 teaspoon almond extract

**Heat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and Flour 13x9
inch pan. In large bowl.**

**Combine cake mix, nuts, margarine and egg at low
speed until crumbly; press in prepared pan. Spread
with preserves. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes.**

**Combine glaze ingredients. Drizzle over warm short-
bread. Cool. Cut into 36 bars.**
