



Viola's Scotcheroos

1st Layer:

Combine 1 cup sugar and 1 cup light corn syrup in a 3 quart saucepan and cook on medium.

Bring to a boil and stir constantly.

Remove from the heat and add:
1 cup of peanut butter (chunky is good) &
6 cups of Rice Krispies.
Stir Well

Press into 9"x13" pan.

2nd Layer:

Combine 6 ounces of chocolate chips
&
6 ounces of butterscotch chips
Heat in saucepan until melted on low.

Spread over rice krispies mixture. Cool.
