May's Fresh Strawberry Pie

- 1 cup sugar**
- 3 Tablespoons Strawberry Jello**
- 4 Tablespoons Cornstarch**
- 1 1/2 c. Water**
- 1/2 teaspoon red food coloring**
- 2 Cups Fresh & Cored Strawberries**
- 1 Baked Pie Shell**
- 8 oz. Whipped Topping or Whipped Cream**
