Rhubarb Cake
(Marilyn Hansen)

Cake:

*1 1/2 c cut up rhubarb
 1/2 cup sugar
 2 c. flour
 1 1/2 c, sugar
 1/2 c. oil
 1 egg
 1 c. sour milk
 1 tsp. vanilla
 1 tsp. soda
 1 tsp. cinnamon*

Directions: Combine rhubarb and sugar. Set aside. Mix flour, sugar, oil, egg, sour milk, vanilla, soda, and cinnamon. Add to rhubarb mixture and bake in 9x13 pan at 350 degrees.

Frosting:

*6 Tablespoons margarine
 1 c coconut
 2/3 c. brown sugar
 1/4 c. milk & 1 c chopped nuts.
 Combine margarine, coconut, brown sugar, milk and nuts. Boil 3 minutes. Pour topping over warm rhubarb cake.*
