I want to convey my appreciation to all of you who contributed your treasured quilt to have on display at the Wayne Senior Center Q125 Quilt Show.



* Please always call in cancellations to the Wayne Senior Center at 375-1460 the day before to be courteous.

*(This applies to home delivered meals and congregate meals.)
Calling the day of the meal is too late, because your meal is already prepared. The Center will be charged your meal if you don't call.

A reminder come enjoy Chartwells meals at the center beginning **September 1st** at the Wayne Senior Center. Suggested contribution per meal will be :
\$3.25 for +60 years old and \$6.00 charge if under 60 years old.

Home Delivered Meals volunteers will pick up meals at Chartwells deliver meals on their routes as usual. Suggested contribution of the meal will be :
\$3.50 if 60+ and \$6.25 charge if -60years old.

Mely's Oreo Ice Cream Peanut Buster Dessert

45 Oreo Cookies Crushed Fine

4 Tbsp Melted Margarine or Butter

1/2 gallon Vanilla Ice Cream

1 cup Dry Roasted Peanuts- Whole or Crushed

1-11.75 oz Smucker's Hot Fudge Topping

1 -8 ounce Extra Rich Cool Whip

Crush cookies, add melted margarine and mix.

Save 1 cup of crumbs for topping (last step)

Press crumbs in 9x13 greased pan. Cool 1 hour.
