1. Approval of Minutes – May 17, 2011

2. Approval of Claims

Anyone desiring to view the Open Meetings Act may do so. The document is available for public inspection and is located on the south wall of the City Council Chambers.

Anyone desiring to speak on an agenda item is invited to do so, and should limit themselves to three minutes. After being recognized by the Chair, proceed to the rostrum and state your name and address for the record.

The City Council may go into closed session to discuss certain agenda items to protect the public interest or to prevent the needless injury to the reputation of an individual and if such individual has not requested a public hearing.

3. Presentation of “Token of Appreciation” to Wayne from former City Administrator Joseph Salitros

Background: Joe was City Administrator at Wayne from 1990 to 2000. He also served in three other cities in Iowa, Illinois and Wisconsin and has recently retired. Joe has made a commitment to donate \$100 per year to each the four cities for each year he served there.

Joe’s presentation to Wayne will be \$600 toward the purchase of two granite park benches for the Phase I Trail built in Wayne by International Stoneworks and \$400 to the Wayne Boy Scout Troop.

4. Action on Application for Special Designated Liquor Permit of The Max Again – July 9th – Beer Garden in Carhart’s Parking Lot for Chicken Show

Background: This event is an annual event at Henoween that requires Council action on a special designated liquor permit.

5. Action on Request to Close the South Portion of the Alley behind White Dog Pub from 12:00 noon until 10:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 13th, for the Hamburger Cookout Competition

Background: This event is in the afternoon. Council approval is required to close the public alley, and our policy requires proof of insurance from White Dog Pub with the City of Wayne named as an additional insured since it will be held on City property.

6. Action on Request to Close Highway 15 between First and Second Streets for the “Stay-Cation” Event Hosted by the Wayne State College Student Activities Board on August 27th

Background: This event is a street dance with a live band and was held for the first time last August. It is a joint project of the Wayne Area Chamber and the WSC Student Senate. The goal is to welcome WSC students back and get students downtown at the beginning of the WSC fall semester and to invite area residents of Wayne to join in with them socially. This event is purposely held off campus and downtown to better involve Wayne area residents.

The request this year is to hold the event on Main Street. Last year this event was held in the parking lot of Godfather’s Pizza and the adjoining half block of 1st Street, plus the alley behind White Dog Pub. The Student Senate last year requested that Main Street be closed between 1st and 2nd Street so that participants over 21 could access both the White Dog and The Max, but there wasn’t time to meet the 60-day response time by the Nebraska Department of Roads for highway closing requests. Godfather’s helped out on short notice by closing their parking lot to regular customers and allowing the event to be set up in there for the evening.

The Department of Roads will not consider a request to close Main Street without Council action approving it.

Background: This is a popular regular event at the Chicken Show and requires Council approval.

13. Action on Request to Host the Nebraska State 4-H BB Gun and Air Rifle Championships at the Wayne Community Activity Center on April 14 and 15, 2012, with Set-up on April 13, 2012

Background: If approved, this will be the 3rd time the State Championship has been held in the CAC gym. Karla will be charging them \$600 for the 3 days of use of the gym. All of the other CAC areas will be open to members. Since the CAC is membership supported, we are careful to not close the CAC gym to member use very often. Depending on the weather, April is often a time of reduced usage by members as they begin to be more active outdoors.

Recommendation: The recommendation of the CAC Director and City Administrator is to approve the three-day rental of the CAC for this event in 2012.

14. Discussion and Action Concerning Liquidated Damages on the Well House and Municipal Well 2009-1 Project

Background: Most city projects include a penalty for not completing a project by the deadline in the bid document. The penalty listed in the bid documents for late completion of City Well #11 is \$238 per day in liquidated damages after the deadline. The primary reason to establish liquidated damages in a bid document is provide a method of enforcement of the project deadline and to cover additional costs to the city caused by the delay.

In many cases, there is no additional cost to the city from projects taking longer than the deadline and liquidated damages are waived. In our specific 2010 UV project to install the Ultraviolet Disinfection System at the wastewater treatment plant, the city was subject to a \$10,000 per day fine by NDEQ beginning May 1st if the new UV system was not in place and operating. That project was completed by the contractor on April 30th. In that bid, the deadline in the bid documents was in February with plenty of time allowed to avoid NDEQ penalties. The engineering firm set the liquidated damages for the UV project at only \$200 per day which almost proved to be totally inadequate for the risk of the situation. Liquidated damages also provide some fairness to the other bidders who may have been able to bid a lower price for a longer completion schedule if it would have been allowed.

Recommendation: The City of Wayne approved one extension of time to the contractor and the date of substantial completion when we began using the well was about another two months. Some additional costs to the city were incurred from the extra time and at this time Garry Poutre and I are still reviewing the actual extra costs with JEO and the general contractor so that they are covered by any

recommendation to you on liquidated damages. We will have a recommendation to you by Tuesday night's council meeting. The complete project is a good quality product, and we have invited JEO and the contractor to attend Tuesday night to answer any questions about our recommendation.

17. [Action on Application for Payment No. 10 in the Amount of \\$197,550.00 to Eriksen Construction Co. for the 2009-2010 Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvements, Phase I Project](#)

Background: This is for work completed according to the contract and approved by JEO.

18. [Action on Change Order for Adding Dissolved Oxygen Sensors to Six more Tanks — 2009-2010 Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvement Project](#)

Background: When we prepared the specifications to build the Aquarius treatment plant, our city committee chose to eliminate some of the dissolved oxygen sensors in the tanks to save cost.

Recommendation: The low bid for construction was significantly lower than expected, and we recommend adding back the DO sensors and monitoring equipment needed to monitor and manage the treatment process. We are awaiting a price commitment from JEO at this time. However, the window for installing the additional sensors and equipment is quickly closing because of the speed of construction. The cost of these additions will not exceed \$46,000 and the life expectancy of this plant is probably more than 30 years. The recommendation of the Utility Supt. and Administrator is to approve the maximum amount for the change order while the additional work can still be done without extra labor.

19. [Resolution 2011-36: Accepting Bid and Awarding Contract on the "Power Plant Cooling Tower Improvement Project – Installation"](#)

Background: The equipment for this project was already bid out, a contract was awarded, and the cooling tower has been ordered. This bid under consideration is for installation only and is the only bid received. The bid you will be considering is about double the original contractor estimate three years ago. However, since that time, prices for piping have increased substantially, we hired a design engineer, and we modified the project to include a \$250,000 federal stimulus energy grant which requires paying federal wage levels and following numerous compliance steps.

Recommendation: With the project cost increase, the expected payback time for this project at \$60,000 savings per year will be 13.3 years if NPPD wholesale rates don't increase for 13 years. If NPPD's wholesale rates continue to increase at a rate between 6% and 11% annually, then the expected payback time is well under the ten-year threshold that we, as city staff, have committed to when we bring you energy savings projects. The recommendation of Electric Supt. and City Administrator is to approve the bid and award the contract.

20. Action to Amend the HDR Professional Services Contract for Engineering Services on the Power Plant Cooling Tower Project

Background: Because of the additional requirements of the federal stimulus grant, we asked HDR for additional professional services to meet those requirements. This agreement is for work HDR has already completed in time to meet the grant requirements. Some additional engineering services will be required during the installation process and to sign off for the feds.

21. Resolution 2011-37: Accepting Bid and Awarding Contract on the Purchase of an Aerial Ladder Truck for Fire Department

Background: The City of Wayne began a cash reserve in 1999 to replace our 35 year old fire department ladder truck. When we reached the cash reserve amount of \$600,000 we authorized the firefighters to prepare specifications to bid out. Three bids were received and are attached. The low bidder is Smeal, a manufacturer in Snyder, Nebraska. This is a obviously an expensive purchase and Tom Sievers, Fire Chief, will be at the meeting to describe how the department uses this type of truck and to answer questions.

Recommendation: The recommendation of the Fire Chief and City Administrator is to accept the low bid and award the contract to Smeal. Manufacture of the truck will take about a year.

22. Resolution 2011-38: Amending Resolution 2011-3 which Approved the Application for Zoning Use by Exception Permit of Dr. Rob Burrows By Describing Property by Legal Description Rather than Street Address

Recommendation: Recommendation of the Planning Commission is to amend the address for this project so that the Use by Exception Permit can be filed with the title at the courthouse.

23. Resolution 2011-39: Setting Board of Equalization Hearing Date for Public Utility Water Service District No. 2009-01 for June 21, 2011, at or about 5:30 p.m. (Muhs Acres Water Main Extension Project)

Background: As part of the agreement for the City of Wayne to build a new water main to Muhs Acres to replace the old service line, former Mayor Shelton and I verbally agreed to allow a \$10,000 credit towards the engineering costs assessed to the residents because of the double water rates they have been paying since the middle 1990's while still paying for their own service line repairs. This credit was omitted in the calculation of the residential property assessments and amounts to

slightly over \$3 per Linear Foot (or 10%) reduction in the residential property assessments.

Recommendation: The final decision on approval of the \$10,000 credit is by the Board of Equalization. The recommendation of the City Administrator is to allow the \$10,000 credit as verbally agreed upon.

24. Resolution 2011-40: Amending Schedule of Fees

Recommendation: The recommendation of the City Planner is to reduce the Moving Permit Fees charged by the city from \$200 per house to \$100 per primary structure and \$50 per accessory structure. Building permits would still be required for these projects.

25. Action to Continue Participation in the Tri-County Mutual Finance Organization for FY2011-12 and to Appoint Lowell Johnson as Representative from the City of Wayne

Recommendation: Last year Wayne joined with Ponca and Ponca Rural Fire District, Wisner and Winside to form the MFO. This qualifies the group to receive up to \$10 per resident in state aid to rural fire departments. Wayne received \$24,000 last year, and this action is required for Wayne to participate again for FY 2011-2012. The recommendation of the Fire Chief and City Administrator is to approve participation in the MFO again.

26. Action on Proposal for Design Services for Pheasant Run Road.

Background: A business prospect is considering a building location on the northeast corner of Hwy 35 and Pheasant Run Road. If the project is built, it will be annexed and will require construction of 500 feet of paved street. Before a paving district can be formed to assess the costs, an engineering firm must provide an estimate of cost and initial design. Garry and Joel have interviewed and selected Advanced Engineering Consultants, a West Point, Nebraska, engineering firm to do the work. This project will need to move very quickly if the business prospect decides to go forward with that location. We will have an agreement for your review at the Council meeting and a recommendation.

The Wayne City Council met in regular session at City Hall on Tuesday, May 3, 2011, at 5:30 o'clock P.M. In addition, he advised the public that the Council may go into closed session to discuss certain agenda items to protect the public interest or to prevent the needless injury to the reputation of an individual and if such individual has not requested a public hearing.

Mayor Chamberlain requested Council consideration to appointing Sandy Brown to the Recreation-Leisure Services Commission.

Councilmember Brodersen made a motion, which was seconded by Councilmember Frevert approving the appointment of Sandy Brown to the Recreation-Leisure Services Commission. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Councilmember Sturm arrived at 5:33 p.m.

Administrator Johnson advised the Council that the claim filed against the City by a former dispatcher, Kate Lassila, for discrimination, retaliation and hostile work environment in the amount of \$167,000 needs to be tabled and forwarded to the City's insurance carrier, EMC, for review.

Councilmember Frevert made a motion and seconded by Councilmember Van Delden to table action on the \$167,000 claim filed by Kate Lassila against the City of Wayne for discrimination, retaliation and hostile work environment and to forward the

same to EMC, the City's insurance carrier, for their review. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Administrator Johnson advised the Council that Tom Sievers was reappointed as Fire Chief by the Wayne Volunteer Fire Department for the upcoming year. The Council must approve the appointment by motion.

Councilmember Sturm made a motion and seconded by Councilmember Van Delden approving the reappointment of Tom Sievers as Fire Chief. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Tom Sievers, Fire Chief, gave a report on the practice house burn that the Volunteer Fire Department did on May 1st.

Administrator Johnson stated the following Resolution would approve the agreement between the City and the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission regarding the grant received for the signage (educational points of interest) for the trail.

Councilmember Sturm introduced Resolution No. 2011-33 and moved for its approval; Councilmember Van Delden seconded.

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-33

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM PROJECT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WAYNE AND THE NEBRASKA GAME AND PARKS COMMISSION FOR THE "RECREATIONAL TRAIL SIGNAGE PROJECT."

Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Administrator Johnson stated the following Resolution would approve the Interlocal Agreement and the Special Operation and Maintenance Agreement between the City and the Lower Elkhorn Natural Resources District for the “Wayne Trail Logan Creek Overlook Bank Stabilization Project.” The project, at this time, is about \$85,000. The NRD will contribute \$25,000. Anthony Lawrence is working on another application to the Nebraska Environmental Trust which, if approved, may lower the City’s cost on the project. The structure of the trail on one side will be undermined and the trail will fail eventually if we don’t do anything. Lower Elkhorn just made their commitment, so the City has one year to start the project. Johnson’s recommendation was that the Council approve the agreements to secure the funding.

Councilmember Sturm introduced Resolution No. 2011-34 and moved for its approval; Councilmember Brodersen seconded.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT AND SPECIAL OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WAYNE AND THE LOWER ELKHORN NATURAL RESOURCE DISTRICT FOR THE “WAYNE TRAIL LOGAN CREEK OVERLOOK BANK STABILIZATION PROJECT.”

Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Garry Poutre, Supt. of Public Works & Utilities advised the Council that the railing at Geno’s Steakhouse is still not installed. Therefore, Council can either table this matter until the next meeting or approve it and hold payment until that has taken place.

Councilmember Sturm made a motion and seconded by Councilmember Frevert to table action on Resolution 2011-35 Accepting the 2010 Wayne Sidewalk Replacement Project and Authorizing Final Payment until the next meeting. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Administrator Johnson stated a pay request has been received from Eriksen Construction Co. for the 2009-2010 Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvements, Phase I Project in the amount of \$328,561.00. The engineer on the project has approved the same.

Garry Poutre, Supt. of Public Works & Utilities, gave an update on the status of the project. Eriksen Construction has submitted a request to the engineer for a 22-day extension because of weather related delays. At this time, they are looking at an August 1st start-up.

Councilmember Sturm made a motion, which was seconded by Councilmember Frevert approving Application for Payment No. 9 for the 2009-2010 Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvements, Phase I Project, in the amount of \$328,561.00 to Eriksen Construction Co. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Garry Poutre, Supt. of Public Works & Utilities advised the Council that the City has not paid Layne Christensen, contractor for the well project, for some time because of some things that have not been completed at the site. The well came on line in mid-January, so the project is now what is called “substantially” complete. We have had liquidated damages ongoing for this project since last July. The cut-off date for liquidated

damages was when we were able to bring the well on line. We met with Layne Christensen recently on some things that needed to be handled for us to completely close out the project. One of those things was providing proof of buying American made products, which is required because there was ARRA Stimulus funding involved with this project. There is also an issue with the roof and the contractor providing a 10-year warranty for the same. We still have not received the warranty certification; however, they have offered the City a deduct of \$1,500 because we don't have the warranty certification. Mr. Poutre will be meeting with another contractor this week to look at the roof to make a determination as to whether or not they think the roof is adequate and will indeed give us 10 years of life without issue and whether or not \$1,500 represents what they would indicate would be about half of what the value of the roof is. We will be talking about closing out this project completely in the near future, and how the Council might want to handle the liquidated damages. We have agreed to go ahead and pay them this \$29,452.27, knowing that we still have the retainer (10%) for liquidated damages.

In regard to the roof, the contractor installed the roof; however, the contractor isn't a certified installer. The roof product is made by Firestone, and Firestone will not warranty the roof unless it is installed by a certified contractor. One of the issues to begin with was that there was a fair amount of wrinkling in the rubber. Dale Paulson, a roofing contractor, is going to look at the roof on behalf of the City.

Liquidated damages up to the date of substantial completion is approximately \$46,000. The retainer on this project is about \$36,000. It was noted that this project should have been completed a year ago. The issue between Layne Christensen, who is the general contractor and his subs, is something for him to work out with his subs. The

City's issue is with Layne Christensen. The City does not need to make money on this, but we should at least cover our costs (engineering and labor costs).

Administrator Johnson advised the Council that on all of these projects, staff works very hard to get the lowest bid possible, and one of things we try to do is to have good relationships with the contractors and engineers. Legally, we can assess the total liquidated damages, but doing so just makes it tougher the next time we are bidding projects out.

Mayor Chamberlain advised the Council that if they feel the liquidated damages might exceed the \$36,000 retainer fee we still have, the matter should be tabled until the next meeting.

Councilmember Frevert made a motion and seconded by Councilmember Sturm to table action on Pay Application No. 10 in the amount of \$29,452.27 to Layne Christensen Co. for the Well House and Municipal Well 2009-1 Project. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Nancy Braden, Finance Director, advised the Council that the Wayne Revolving Loan Fund to Felix Industries is uncollectible. The auditors have recommended that this loan be written off so it can be taken off the books. The total amount to be written off as of this date is \$41,833.94. This is the third loss the City has had in the 20 years of having a revolving loan fund.

Councilmember Frevert made a motion, which was seconded by Councilmember Haase to write-off the Wayne Revolving Loan Fund Loan of Felix Industries in the amount of \$41,833.94. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call

being all Yeas, with the exception of Councilmember Sturm who voted Nay, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Administrator Johnson stated in 2000, the Community Activity Center was opened with a policy that a person had to be 12 years or older to go unaccompanied in the CAC. Over time, we were letting a few in that were under 12 years of age. We recently asked our insurance carrier if we could change that policy. Their response was that somebody 18 years or older had to accompany those children. After submitting a couple of proposals to our insurance carrier, they have agreed to the following change:

“To use the Community Activity Center, children of the age of 8 and below must be accompanied with supervision of a person age 18 or older or a person 12 or older that holds a current Red Cross Babysitter Certification.”

Karla Jensen, Community Activity Center Director, was present, and stated that when the facility was built, the intent was that it was supposed to be a safe place for kids to go and we don't want to lose sight of that. It's difficult for every person to have an 18 year old to look after their kids, but she thinks it is necessary. After school, the CAC is mass chaos. After implementing the “After School Program”, they got a better handle on it. Those children 8 and younger who are enrolled in the “After School Program” do not have to be accompanied by an 18 year old. She felt this was a good recommendation, and she is looking into becoming certified to teach the Red Cross Babysitter class so that it can be offered more than twice a year.

Councilmember Brodersen made a motion and seconded by Councilmember Haase to amend the policy on the age limits for unattended children at the Community Activity Center as follows, with a trial period of one year beginning June 1st:

“To use the Community Activity Center, children of the age of 8 and below must be accompanied with supervision of a person age 18 or older or a person age 12 or older that holds a current Red Cross Babysitter Certification.”

Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Councilmember Sturm made a motion and seconded by Councilmember Brodersen to enter into executive session for the annual review of the City Administrator and to protect the reputation of the Administrator, and to allow Attorney Pieper to be in attendance. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and executive session began at 6:28 p.m.

Mayor Chamberlain again stated that the matter to be discussed in execution session relates to the annual review of the City Administrator.

Councilmember Sturm made a motion and seconded by Councilmember Frevert to resume open session. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and open session resumed at 6:58 p.m.

Councilmember Frevert made a motion and seconded by Councilmember Sturm to adjourn the meeting. Mayor Chamberlain stated the motion, and the result of roll call being all Yeas, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 7:01 p.m.

4.03 Liquidated Damages

A. CONTRACTOR and OWNER recognize that time is of the essence of this Agreement and that OWNER will suffer financial loss if the Work is not completed within the times specified in paragraph 4.02 above, plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with Article 12 of the General Conditions. The parties also recognize the delays, expense, and difficulties involved in proving in a legal or arbitration proceeding the actual loss suffered by OWNER if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, OWNER and CONTRACTOR agree that as liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty), CONTRACTOR shall pay OWNER \$ 242.00 for each calendar day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 4.02 for completion and readiness for final payment until the Work is completed and ready for final payment. (Liquidated damages are calculated as per Section 108.08 of the Nebraska Department of Roads Standards Specifications 1997).

B. The CONTRACTOR agrees:

1. To pay, according to the formula listed below in this Subsection, liquidated damages for each calendar day beyond the number of calendar days authorized for completion of the contract, and

2. To authorize the ENGINEER to recommend, and OWNER to deduct liquidated damages from any money due or coming due the CONTRACTOR.

C. If no monies are due the CONTRACTOR, the OWNER shall have the right to recover liquidated damages from the CONTRACTOR, from the surety, or from both the CONTRACTOR and the surety.

D. Liquidated damages will not be assessed for any days covered by an approved time extension. Deductions or payment of liquidated damages will not release the CONTRACTOR from further obligations and liabilities to complete the entire contract.







Enclosed for the Council's consideration are four (4) copies of Application for Payment No. 10 for the above referenced project. Work completed this month includes more backfill, masonry, Aquarius diffuser piping installation, yard piping, manholes, and electrical work. The Contractor is seeking payment on \$3,337,271.75 less retainage and previous payments. JEO recommends payment in the amount of \$197,550.00 to Eriksen Construction Co. Inc.

A progress meeting was held on May 26, 2011 and meeting minutes are enclosed. Also enclosed with the pay application are copies of the daily field reports with a copy also being forwarded to staff for review. Materials testing results enclosed also show work is meeting specifications.

The Aquarius wall structures are complete and minor wall caps need to be completed. The Contractor is still working on piping and backfilling the lift station and Aquarius tank areas. Progress is being made on the headworks building too. The blower discharge piping was also installed this month.

Due to wet weather the Contractor experienced some delays this last month. If weather improves, significant progress can occur, however it is our opinion at this time the Contractor will likely not meet the completion date. They have asked for a time extension due to winter conditions; however, in our opinion this winter was not significantly unusual and the City has denied the extension. It is our opinion that a September - October completion is probably more realistic. We are working to discuss this with NDEQ however their staff is out of the office in Kansas City and could not be contacted. Next week we should be able to talk to them.

It is also our opinion that the delays were likely due to several of the following factors. One, the Contractor could have worked on the lift station sooner per the older schedules but needed materials which weren't immediately available. Two, obtaining materials in a timely fashion has been an issue in certain instances, which has caused delays. Examples are lintels, structural steel, and concrete manholes. Lastly, the sheer size and complexity of the project and coordination just may require additional time to ensure that the work is done correctly.





Enclosed for the Council's consideration are two proposals for additional electrical work as a part of the above referenced project.

Proposal #1, also known as Work Change Directive #4, is for electrical work omitted from the electrical plans. The equipment for this work was shown on the civil plans. This includes extending power and return signal to the total suspended solids probe and magnetic flow meter being added to the facility sludge pump. This will require multiple junction boxes, conduit, wire, and labor to complete these tasks, one of which is in an electrical classified area. The proposal request compensation of \$12,560.80. We recommend approval of this change order as it is required to make these systems operable.

Proposal #2 is for the installation of six additional dissolved oxygen meters. Late in the design process this instrumentation was removed from the project design due to concerns about anticipated cost of the project. However, because the project is under budget, there is a desire to add this back into the project as the budget allows. The purpose of this proposal is to add additional monitoring equipment to facilitate the operation for the operator. It eliminates the task of the operator manually completing the readings on a routine basis, possibly daily saving about 0.5 hr labor/day. We expect the reduced labor to offset the cost of the units based on a life cycle costs presented to staff. To date, some additional conduits at the building have been installed to allow the floor pour to progress but no other work from this proposal has been completed. The proposal amount for consideration is \$43,326.23. This proposal is optional and is NOT REQUIRED. The work in proposal #2 is not critical to project completion but is significant in nature and the Contractor should be allowed additional time to complete construction of this work as a part of the contract. It is estimated to take approximately 180 hours which is about 1 month labor. We would recommend a 1 month extension for this Change Order.

Upon your consideration, please advise us of your decision so that we can prepare a change order reflecting these changes the Council elects to complete and we will forward for everyone's signature.





Dear Lowell,

As you are aware, HDR is performing engineering services related to the new cooling tower at the power plant. Our contract is on a time-and-materials basis. When we spoke several weeks ago, I indicated that we would be requesting additional fees, and I would send a justification email to you. We have completed the installation package design work, and those bidding documents have been transmitted to Gene Hansen.

The current purchase order from the City has a \$50,000 limit. At the time that the work was started, this was the estimated fee for the Task 100 – Design Engineering activities. Our actual design costs are higher than the \$50,000 amount, and I request that the purchase order be increased for additional design services. I request that this amount be increased by \$15,000. Any unused fees here can be applied to Task 200. Some of the reasons for the additional costs include remobilizing the design team after the project was put on hold, incorporation of the ARRA bidding requirements, and soil conditions encountered in the geotechnical report.

Also, the initial proposal did not include any allowance for Task 200 – Construction Period Services. These services would include shop drawing review, answering contractor/bidder questions, and responding to field orders. This work will be done on an on-call basis, but I suggest allowing \$5,000 for this work.
